Residents are reminded that level-2 water restrictions are still in place and must be adhered to.

Level-2 water restrictions according to section 44 (3) of the Water Services Bylaw states that all consumers are forthwith compelled:

- a) Not to water and irrigate their gardens from 6am and 6pm every day;
- b) Not to fill their swimming pools with municipal water; and
- c) Not to use hosepipes to wash their cars, paved areas, etc.

Water saving tips

- Don't leave taps dripping;
- Take shallow baths; and
- Use bathwater or grey-water to water the garden.

We urge residents to remain active partners in reducing the amount of water used in the City of Johannesburg, and to report any form of vandalism and theft of water infrastructure to 0800 00 25 87.
